Where 200,000 British Soldiers Died to Hold the Gate

Paris, July 31.—(Canadian Press.)—
The anniversary of the opening of the third battle of Ypres was marked on Saturday by a pilgrimage to Ypres under the auspices of the Ypres League, in which Belgium, France and British delegates participated, says a Reuter despatch from Ypres. The British delegation included the Earl of Ypres (Field Marshal French), Lieut-Gen. Sir Wm. Pulteney, Major-Gen. Sir John Headlamb, and several British ex-soldiers who fought at Ypres.

Addressing the gathering, the Earl of Ypres recalled that the British army occupied Ypres more than four years ago and that 200,000 British soldiers were killed there while holding the gate to Calais and the channel ports.

Berlin, July 31—France has rejected Germany's request for a reduction in the monthly payments on the debts contacted by German nationals with allied citizens, prior to the world war. The French note gives the German government ten days in which to signify that full payments will be continued in accordance with the London agreement and the decision of the allied clearing house offices; otherwise certain fixed measures will be applied automatically.


