GAVE MILLIONS

Mrs. Pullman Disposed of Some \$12,000,000 to Charities Before Death—Left \$4,000,000.

Chicago, April 11.—Mrs. George M. Pullman's will, filed for probate, disposed of an estate valued at \$4,000,000, the bulk of which is left to her two daughters, Mrs. Florence Lowden, wife of former Governor Frank O. Lowden, and Mrs. Harriet Carolan. With the filing of the will it was announced that Mrs. Pullman had given to charities, within recent years, approximately \$13,000,000. Mrs. Pullman was the widow of George M. Pullman, pioneer railway builder.

Her daughters are to receive the residuary estate after payment of a legacy of \$250,000 to the Pullman Free School Manual Training and definite small sums to the grandchildren, nieces, nephews and household servants of Mrs. Pullman. A clause in the will specifies that in the event of an attempt to contest the will the heirs' bequests shall vest in the residuary estate.

The wedding took place at the groom's residence and after the ceremony a luncheon was served. The young married pair will reside at North Head.

The death of Gilbert M. Peck occurred at his home in Wolfville, N. S., on April 7. He was 79 years of age and a former resident of Hopewell Hill, N. B.

Dr. Fred J. White, of Moncton, died suddenly yesterday morning at his home, death being due to apoplexy. He leaves a wife and one daughter, Miss Marion. He was a native of Newfoundland and was educated there and at Mount Allison University, Sackville, and McGill University, from which institution he was graduated with the degree of M.D.C.M. In 1886 he became government surgeon in Labrador, remaining there until 1888. He was a member of the medical corps during the Riel rebellion and was present at the decisive battle of Batoche in 1885. For his bravery under fire he was awarded a medal and clasp. He held the rank of major in the 74th infantry of which he was the surgeon for several years. After graduation from McGill he resided in Shediac for some time and while there was united in marriage with Miss Ella M. Webster. Thirty years ago he took up practice in Moncton. He was mayor of Moncton in 1907 and 1908 and from 1909 to 1910 was president of the Moncton Canadian Club. He was a Conservative and a Presbyterian.

The funeral of Mrs. James Tipping was held yesterday afternoon from her residence, 18 Stanley street. Service was held at 4 o'clock by Rev. Dr. Hutchinson and interment was made in Cedar Hill cemetery.

WOMEN TO RUN KANSAS TOWN; TWO GRANDMOTHERS AT HEAD
Thayer, Kan., April 11.—Two widowed grandmothers, three housewives and a woman telephone operator will administer the affairs of this town of 400 population for the next year. An entire woman's ticket, campaigning without a platform was swept into power in yesterday's election by a majority of four to one.

Members of the new administration include: Mayor—Mrs. A. H. Forest, widow, three children and eight grandchildren. Police Judge—Hattie Brewster, widow, four children and four grandchildren. All the new town council are women. Every member of the new administration is also a church worker.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES
The ocean-going tug Otis Wack was launched on Saturday from the shipyard of W. R. Huntley & Co., at Parrsboro, N. S. She is 107 feet in length and about 230 tons gross and is built for the Gypsum Packet Co. of Windsor for towing plaster barges to New York. She will be taken to Hantsport to take on lumber and fittings for her cabin. She will then go to York for towing machinery installed and her deckhouse put on. The launching of this tug closed the shipyard on that shore and shipbuilding it at a standstill in that vicinity.

MILEAGE BOOKS GOOD ON BOTH THE LINES
Under co-ordination of Canadian National and Grand Trunk lines of railway, a recent order enables the use of mileage books issued by one road on the trains of the other company if desired. Previously, if a business man were traveling from Toronto to Ottawa for example, his Canadian National "book" would be valid to that point. But if he wished to continue his journey to Montreal over the Grand Trunk, it would not have been good on the G. T. R. train. The order just issued wipes out the distinction, in a mileage-book sense, between C. N. R. and G. T. R. Books issued by the Grand Trunk and good over all eastern lines of the Canadian National and, likewise, those issued by the C. N. R. are valid on the trains of the G. T. R.

BIGAMY CHARGED.
Woman Married Again During Husband's Last Hours.
London, April 11.—Seven hours before her husband died, Alice Foster, thirty-three, who was living with her husband at Prince George road, Stoke Newington, is alleged to have bigamously married David Robert Spence at St. Mathias' church, Stoke Newington. A dramatic story was told at North London, where the woman was charged.
Spence, a porter, gave formal evidence of his "marriage" with prisoner, which ceremony took place at 2.30 p. m. Detective Sergeant Oakley spoke to seeing accused at her address and telling her that at the time of the second "marriage" her husband was alive at Queen's road, Dalston, but that he died at 9.30 p. m. the same day. "I wish he had died years before," was her reply. She rushed into the kitchen, asking him to stay in the parlour, but he followed and stopped her as she was attempting to get a table knife. She exclaimed, "I will do myself in." Foster has driven me to this, Spence is innocent. I have misled him all the time. He does not know of my seven children, who are in the workhouse." A porter which prisoner wrote to Spence after her arrest was handed to the magistrate, who declared it was too affecting to read. A remand was ordered.

RENT PROFITEER'S FATE.
Imprisoned For Exploiting War Widow—Must Refund.
Paris, April 11.—M. Margallou had the good luck two years ago to find an unfurnished apartment in Paris for the rental of three thousand francs. He bought fourteen thousand francs worth of furniture and furnished it. Then he let his new furnished apartment to a war widow for 1,800 francs monthly. In two years he had got all his money back, one thousand francs interest and still had his apartment and his furniture. A French magistrate, however, considered that money should not be made so quickly and has therefore sent M. Margallou to prison for two months, fined him 800 francs and ordered the repayment of 8,000 francs to the tenant.

BREAD WAR IN HAMILTON.
Hamilton, Ont., April 11.—The price of bread is down. This is due to a battle of prices which has broken out in the city among the majority of the bakers, to the great advantage of the housewives. Several prominent firms announced a reduction of two cents per twenty-four ounce standard loaf, with the result that these loaves are being sold for ten cents each. The radical reduction follows as a result of price cutting tactics which have been maintained recently.


