

ROADS IN QUEBEC

Loan Money to the Municipalities at Rate of Three Per Cent.

Montreal, Jan. 80—A complete revision of the act creating the Quebec public utilities commission is made in Hon. L. A. Taschereau's bill in the legislature, says a despatch from Quebec to the Montreal Gazette. The powers given the Montreal Gazette.
