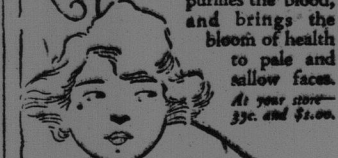

## CANADIAN TRADE WITH JAMAICA

Tariff on Basis of Imperial Preference Urged.

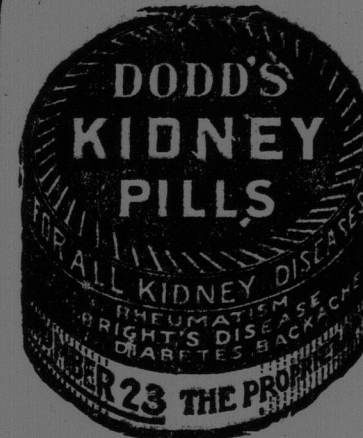
Kingston, Jamaica, May 5—An im- portant decision has been reached by the legislative council. In a message from the governor attention was drawn to the conference which is to be held at Ot- tawa, Canada, this month, to which it was proposed that Jamaica should send a delegate, accompanied if necessary by expert advisers.

At this conference there is to be con- sidered the question of trade relations and transport facilities between Canada and the British West Indies. Since the preference granted in 1897 by Canada, and particularly since 1912, when Can- ada made a reciprocal arrangement with most of the West Indies (although Ja- maica stood out), there has been a marked growth of trade between these two areas. The recent meeting of the As- sociated West Indian Chambers of Com- merce passed a resolution urging the as- sembly of representatives of imperial Canadian and West Indian governments, to consider the development of trade re- lations and cognate matters.

To the present conference each sepa- rate West Indian administration will send one representative. The Canadian government has the right to declare that any proposal not acceptable to it shall not be entertained. Questions discussed will be decided by a majority of votes. This movement is quite in line with public feeling here, which, although either hostile or indifferent to the pro- posal for closer political connection with Canada, is very willing to develop busi- ness relations with the dominion.

After a long discussion the council de- cided to instruct the Jamaica repre- sentative to urge that a tariff on the basis of imperial preference should be adopted between the Dominion of Canada and the British West Indies, and that the classification of the tariff should be uni- form, that as extensive a free list as pos- sible be obtained from the dominion, and the support given to a plan for improv- ing shipping facilities between Canada and the British West Indies, and that the Dutch standard and all color tests in respect of the importation of British West Indian sugar be removed imme- diately. A proposal that the delegate should protest against any debate of a political union was rejected.

Later, there was added to the instruc- tion a direction to inquire if it would be possible to arrange for the Canadian



trade agencies throughout the world to be engaged to help the trade of this is- land by advising the government of Ja- maica of suitable markets for Jamaica products. He was also instructed to promise a preference on flour to be ef- fected by decreasing the duty on flour when it is produced within the empire. The present import duty on flour here is 38. per barrel.
