HALDANE AND DEFENCE

Lord Haldane in his address in Montreal, discussing the question of Imperial defence, said that it would be a great relief to the United Kingdom if Canada decided to assist and that it would be a source of great strength to the Empire, as the burden is very heavy for the little islands of the United Kingdom to bear.

The Standard is not honest in this matter. Lord Haldane made no reference whatever to a gift of Dreadnoughts from Canada to the Admiralty to be manned and maintained at the expense of the British taxpayer.

The members of the Manufacturers' Association will make a very short stay in St. John, and will be asleep most of the time. Let us hope that in their waking hours hereabouts, they may be duly impressed with the opportunities for establishing successful industries.

It is intimated that the Borden government finds itself somewhat affected by the financial stringency. It will, however, go on spending the money in the most lavish manner, in order that there may not be so large a surplus as to attract public attention to the propriety of making some reductions in the tariff, which would be distasteful to its friends.

The Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, the British postmaster-general, replying to an address of welcome in the city of Quebec, spoke in both English and French. The number of Canadian statesmen outside of the province of Quebec who can speak both languages is still very limited, and yet the second language should be regarded by them as a very desirable possession.

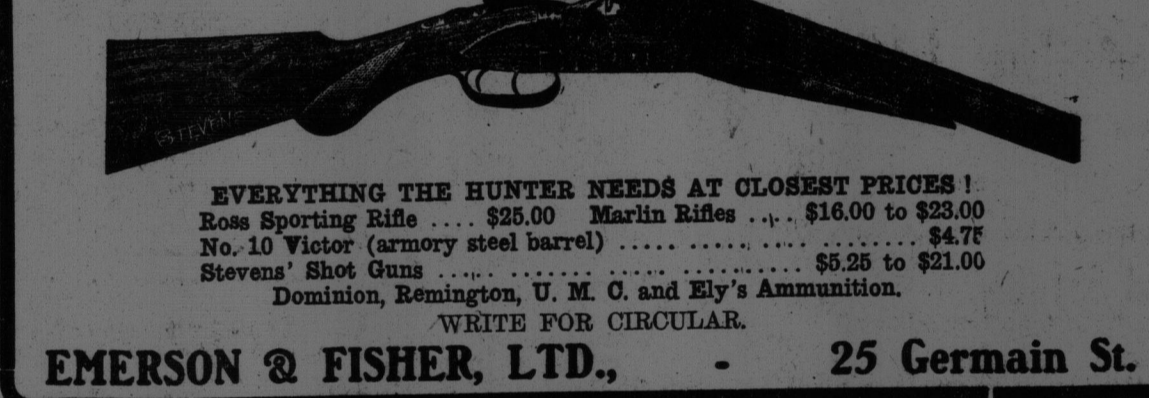

BRITAIN'S POSTMASTER STARTS TOUR OF CANADA

Quebec, Sept. 5—Right Hon. Mr. Samuel, British postmaster-general and Hon. Mr. Pelletier, Canada's postmaster-general left Quebec today for Montreal and will leave there tonight. They will reach Port Arthur on Sunday morning and will spend a quiet day in Port Arthur and Port William. They will leave Port William on Sunday evening, and reach Winnipeg the following day.

On arriving here yesterday, Mr. Samuel was met by Hon. Mr. Pelletier, and conveyed across the river. Mr. Samuel will be the guest of Mr. Pelletier during his stay in Canada. In the city hall a civic reception was given in his honor. Mayor Drouin read an address and Mr. Samuel responded in both English and French.

A banquet was tendered Mr. Samuel at Kent House, Montmorency Falls, last evening. Hon. L. P. Pelletier occupied the chair. Speeches were delivered by Hon. L. P. Pelletier, Right Hon. Mr. Samuel, Mayor Drouin, Alderman Cannon, and Joseph Poirer, vice-president of the Board of Trade. The party returned here at 11 o'clock.
