WHY FIVE CENT FARES STILL ARE POSSIBLE
Washington, Oct. 3.—Electric railway troubles can only be cured if a cure is possible, by honest dealing, efficient management and effective workers. Thomas E. Mitten, president of the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company, told the federal electrical railway commission, when its hearings were resumed today. The co-operative plan of operation followed by this company, he said, was what had made retention of the five cent fare possible, and at the same time allowed increased wages for employees and dividends to stockholders.

"If the forces of labor and management will combine so effectively as to produce almost 100 per cent. more per man employed, as we are doing," he said, "much if not all that is required to overcome the high cost of living will have been accomplished."

Mr. Mitten predicted that receiverships would be instituted for street railways in many cities, and said that fares sufficiently high to pay the cost of service would have to be established. Valuations to determine investment charges on which to base cost of service charges, he said, should be fixed by the cost of reproduction now.

PREMIER CLEMENCEAU IS OF NOBLE DESCENT.
Paris, Oct. 3.—Georges Clemenceau, premier of France, is of noble descent, according to the Armorial Français, which has been looking up his pedigree. The Clemenceau family, it says, can be traced to Jehan Clemenceau, master printer and librarian of Lower Poitou, who in the fifteenth century obtained from Louis XII a patent of nobility and henceforth was known as Jehan Clemenceau de la Clemenceure. The arms granted to him consisted of "two keys argent crossed on a field azure."
