We acknowledge with gratitude a visit from Dr. McKay of Formosa, accompanied by a native helper, both of whom were heard in February last, with much acceptance. The same thanks are due Dr. Marion Oliver, who gave an address at a union meeting in the Lecture Room of Chalmer's Church during April; also Miss Baker in September, gave an account of her work among Indian women and children in Prince Albert, at a union meeting in our own Hall; again, in November, Mr. Goforth described his work in Honan, China, at a union meeting in St. Andrew's Church.

We have also had an interesting account from Mrs. Cochrane of our Mission Stations in British Columbia, while a synopsis of the Presbyterial and Annual Meetings was given by our delegates.

The mode of raising funds for the Society is mainly by an optional membership fee, although most of our members contribute one dollar annually. Mite boxes are distributed, and a collection taken at monthly meetings.

The chief topic discussed at our meetings lately has been how to awaken greater interest in Foreign Missions—how to increase our membership—how are we to make our meetings more successful and more interesting.

Eleven meetings have been held during the year, average attendance 12. A bale valued at \$54.35 was sent to Prince Albert.

The annual Thankoffering Meeting was held, as usual, in November; the offerings, added to the contents of the mite boxes sent in at the end of the year, amounted to \$49.77.

Owing to severe family bereavement and subsequent ill-health, the Secretary has not been able to act for some time, but her place has been taken by the Treasurer.
