

Passports

Residents of this Colony, latending to travel out of Newfoundland, are hereby notified that they may be required to produce Passports at various points on their journey.

Passports are issued at the Department of the Colonial Secretary, in accordance with Rules and Regulations approved by the Governor in Council, to persons domiciled in Newfoundland, who

1. Natural-born British aubjects; 2. The wives and widows of such

3 Persons naturalized in the United Kingdom, in the British Colonies, or in India.

A Passport cannot be issued on schalf of a person already sbroad: meh person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be ent out of Newfoundland he post.

Applicants are requested to have their Forms of Application (which an be obtained at this Department). roperly filled in, according to marinal instructions thereon, and forrarded to the Department in suffiient time to permit of any necessary alterations being made in the same before the date upon which

the Passport would be required. The charge for a Passport is \$2.50. ifter which it may be reneved for four further periods of two years ach, at a charge of \$1.00 for each
