### HOCKEY PLAYER KILLED BY POLICE IN CONNECTION WITH DEATH OF MCCURT

Member of Cornwall Team Injured During Match, Did Not Regain Consciousness.

Cornwall, Ont., March 7.—Owen McCourt, better known as "Bud," died this morning as a result of injuries received last night in the hockey match played here between the Ottawa Victorias and Cornwallis. Just before McCourt passed away, Charlie Masson, of the Ottawa team, was arrested at the Hotel Luchette by Chief Smyth on a charge of assault, with intent to do grievous bodily harm. Now that McCourt is dead, the charge will be amended.

Coroner Hamilton is having a jury empanelled for inquest to-day. McCourt received his injuries early in the second half of the match, which had been growing in roughness up till this incident occurred. McCourt and Throp had a little mix-up and this was followed by several slashes with sticks. It is claimed that Throp struck McCourt, who started to retaliate when he was struck a terrific blow over the head by Masson. Throp then struck McCourt about this time received a very ugly cut over the head from a Cornwall player, and was unable to continue.

McCourt came on again for a few minutes, but he had to quit, and becoming unconscious, was taken to the Hotel Dieu hospital at the general hospital an operation was performed in an attempt to relieve the pressure on the brain, but the brain was bleeding, and he passed away without regaining consciousness.

Masson took great very calmly, and acted as he should be released on bail, but as McCourt died about that very time, this was out of the question. He was escorted by Chief Smyth to the police station, where he remains in custody.

There is also some talk of arresting Throp, but so far nothing has been done in the matter. Throp was the eldest son of the late Patrick McCourt, who died here last spring. He was 24 years of age, and a fine young man of splendid physique. He has been playing hockey for four or five years, and in 1905 he figured with some four other Cornwall boys on Wood- team in the O. H. A. He was a very fast player and clever stick-handler, and while quick tempered, he was no rough player by any means. He also played on the Cornwall lacrosse team part of last season.

—After the beginning of April, it will cost Victorians thirty-five cents for a half-cut. This is the decision of the local boards, which have decided to increase in the wages, which were granted the men upon their urgent demand. The tariff for other insular attention remains the same.

## THE ELECTIONS IN MANITOBA

### ROBLIN GOVERNMENT SUSTAINED IN POWER

**Liberals Will Have Increased Representation in the New Legislature—Minister Defeated.**

(Special to the Times.)  
Winnipeg, March 8.—Yesterday's provincial elections resulted in the defeat of Edward Brown's heroic effort to introduce a pure standard of political methods and a postponement of his intention to form a government which would be honest and straightforward, dealing with public affairs entirely on their merits.

In the House of 41, the Liberal party have the seat of the Roblin party have a further reduced majority, but with a greatly reduced majority, the Liberals having secured six additional seats, increasing their representation to thirteen.

The Liberal leader, Mr. Brown, was beaten in Portage by 223, and Horace Cheever was beaten by 71. Hon. D. H. McFadden, however, lost in Emerson by 109, while Attorney-General Campbell has only two of a majority in Morris, and on a recount, which will be demanded, may lose. Three Winnipeg voters Conservative, Gordon winning by 14 in South Johnstone. Liberals had a majority of 218 in West. Roberts' majority in Dufferin was clipped in two.

Coroner Hamilton in the province was secured by Mr. Baird, Liberal, in Mountain, 43. It is Greenway's old district.

With two elections yet to be held, the House stands: Conservatives, 22; Liberals, 19. The Liberals lost four seats and gained 10. The following were elected:
