



about sixty years of age and for many years bore the reputation of being one of the most cool-headed and scientific naval officers in the Russian service. He distinguished himself in the Russo-Turkish war in 1877 by an attack on a Turkish ironclad in a gunboat, the


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ordered early in August, 1904, to have his squadron in readiness to proceed from the Baltic around to Vladivostok. This proved to be one of the most remarkable voyages ever made, and re-sulted in the annihilation of the Rus-sian Baltic fleet. The start was made stan Battic neet. The start was made from Libau on October 16 of that year and, passing around Denmark, the Rus-sians encountered the British North Sea fishing fleet off Dogger Bank. The warships fired on the fishermen, mis-taking them for torpedo boats, which led to a strained state of affairs between Great Britain and Russia that at one time threatened to result in hos-

tilities between the two countries. An international commission of inquiry, however, which met at Paris, after a complete investigation excused the ad-miral for his action, while condemning the firing.


