KID MCCOY EXPECTS TO STARTLE BOXING WORLD

One Time Trickiest Boxer in the Ring Thinks He Has Come Back and Can Beat the Best of Them—Wants to Battle for Heavyweight Honors.

What Training Has Done For Kid McCoy.

Reduced his waist measurement from 38 inches to 32 inches. Increased the girth of his chest from 37 inches to 42 inches. Increased his height from 5 feet 11½ inches to 6 feet ¼ inch. Increased his weight from 170 pounds to 195 pounds. Removed all superfluous flesh from his body and hardened his muscles almost to the solidity of steel.

Miracles McCoy Thinks He Is Able To Perform.

To beat twenty-five middleweights and heavyweights in the West, and, if possible, keep out of the newspapers. Then to go to New York and beat some of the best of the heavyweights. Finally to challenge Jack Johnson and win the championship of the world from Jack Johnson. Many experts in matters pugilistic will give McCoy at this, and perhaps the Kid's intentions and pretensions are a matter for ridicule.

The old-timers will say that "they never came back" and that McCoy will be no exception to the rule, that he may look good to the eye and appear to the observer to be in better physical condition than ever, but that years of continued dissipation have left an indelible mark that his vitality has been sapped, and that he could not withstand the attacks of a younger pugilist.

All of which may or may not be true. Nevertheless, McCoy, within the short space of a year, has accomplished some wonderful things that provide food for thought. By persistent effort, he has brought about a complete transformation in his physical and mental make-up. His old friends scarcely recognize him. They cannot believe their eyes. And they cannot comprehend his talk, for he discusses things aesthetic and altruistic.

A Wonderful Transformation. A year ago, after months spent in his Broadway ratkeller, he measured more by an inch about the waist than he did around his chest. Now his chest measurement is greater by nine inches than the girth of his waist. A year ago he weighed 170 pounds and was fat. Today he weighs 195 pounds and is lean and as hard as nails. A year ago he was 5 feet 11½ inches in height. Today he stands 6 feet ¼ inch in his stocking feet. How did he accomplish all this?

"Simple enough," said McCoy who had applied the tape measure and satisfied himself as to the change in measurements. "Anybody can do as much if he will try. A year ago, as I sat in my ratkeller watching the

patrons filling themselves with harmful liquor, my better nature suddenly revolted. I got up, put on my hat and coat and abandoned the place, letting it go into other hands. I washed my hands of that alleged sporting life right there.

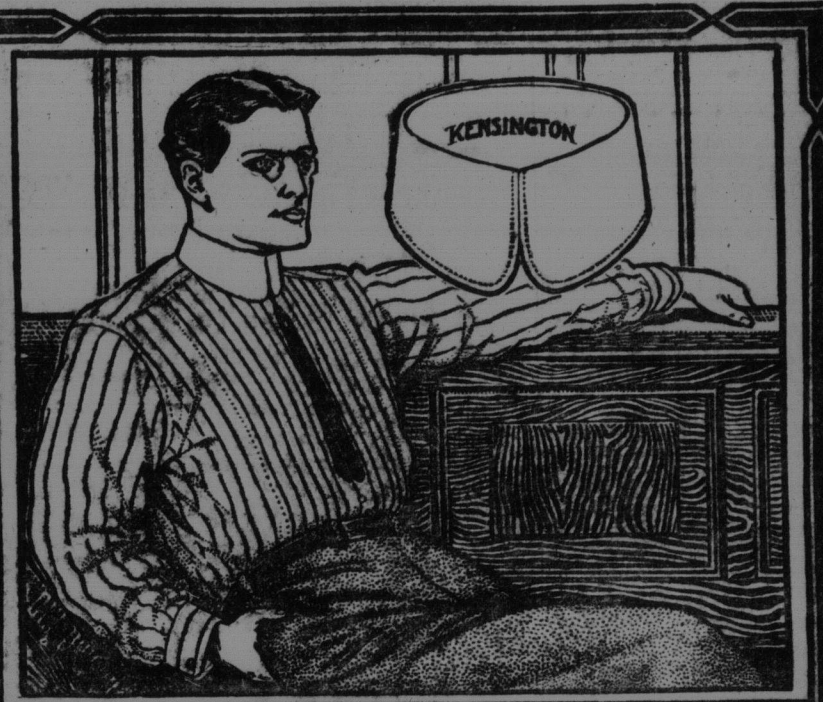
