Shipping Notes.
C. P. R. Royal mail Steamship Em-
press of Britain, Captain Porter, sail-
ing for London, will depart for St

senger list.

British schooner Adriatic in com-
mand of Capt. Barnack, from Anti-
gua, Barbados, and Trinidad, is now
out 20 days for this port with a car-
go of molasses for the Cross Island
Sugar Company, due any moment.

Nova Scotia schooner Jest, which
brought a cargo of hard coal from
New York to this port recently, de-
parted for England to load pas-
sengers and freight for New York.

Steam Press of Britain now in
port, reports Nov. 23, lat. 44° N. lon.
46° W.

The fleet of schooners which put
into St. John a few days ago, owing
to the storm, sailed yesterday for
their destinations.

A tug Pejespect arrived at Bath on
Sunday evening last from Salmon
River, N. B., with the last two car-
gos of pulp shes which were dis-
charged. The tug it is said, may go
to New York this winter.

The lumber shipments by the firm
of S. St. C. and H. Jones, of Wey-
mouth, Nova Scotia, total over six
million feet, viz., three million from
Weymouth, half million from Hanis-
port, three quarters million from
St John, and one quarter million
from Halifax. They are now loading one
vessel at Halifax for Buenos Ayres
to take 1500 tons of lumber to Wey-
mouth. This year the firm cleared the
term schooner Evadne for Sagua, Cu-
ba, with 450,000 feet lumber and
schooner Queen Elizabeth with 165,-
000 feet lumber. Their last heavy ship-
ment from Weymouth for this year
is now being put aboard the steamer
Benjamin F. Poole, about one million feet.
