FREDERICTON
NEWS IN BRIEF

Contracts for Valley Line Soon
—71st Officers May Erect
Bungalow—Horton Team
Visits Capital.

Fredericton, April 5.—A. R. Gould,
President of St. John and Quebec
Railway Company, arrived at noon to-
day from an extended trip to the Pa-
cific coast, having spent several weeks
recuperating in Southern California.
Today he has been in conference with
company officials and it is believed
that in a short time announcements
for the construction of the first sec-
tions of the road will be made. Mr.
Gould will return to his home at
Presque Isle, Me., tomorrow morning.
The annual meeting of the officers
of the 71st York Regiment was held
today at the Barker House, Lieut. Col.
H. F. McLeod presiding. Officers
were elected and a committee appoint-
ed to take up the question of a bun-
galow for the officers at Camp Sus-
sex, and the committee has power to
act. Lieut. Col. McLeod was present-
ed with a handsome certificate of
honorary membership of the British
Naval and Military Veterans' Asso-
ciation of Boston, whose guest he was
in the Hub several months ago.
The Horton Academy Baseball club
from Wolfville, N. S., are here for the
Easter holidays and are playing a
series of games. This afternoon they
played the Y. M. C. A. team at the
Y. M. C. A. gymnasium, and the game
resulted in a tied score of 19-19. The
Wolfville team declined to play off
the tie. Porter, the big center player
scored 17 of the Horton Academy's
19 points. Tomorrow afternoon the
Horton Academy and Fredericton
High School teams play.
Attorney General Grimmer who was
in the city today left for St. Stephen
this evening to spend Easter, and all
of the out of town members of the
government and legislature are now
out of the city. It is now predicted
that it will take at least ten days
after the House resumes next week
to clear up the business of the session.

DIES AFTER LONG
CAREER OF NARROW
ESCAPES FROM DEATH

Rockport, Maine, April 5.—Captain
Jabez Amsbury, who had escaped
death in wrecks and fires in the 52
years that he sailed all the oceans of
the world, died at his home here to-
day. He was 72 years old and retired
five years ago.
Captain Amsbury seven times sailed
around the world. His most thrilling
trips were as master of the Rockland
ship William H. Macy and the Bath
ship Roanoke. The Macy while on a
voyage to Yokohama, was run down
by a British steamer. The collision
occurred near land and the ship was
beached, no lives being lost.
The Roanoke sailed for 2,500 miles
in the Pacific with her cargo of coal
afire, bound from Norfolk to San
Francisco in 1901. The ship was
saved but later the Roanoke was
burned to the water's edge in Nelson Bay,
near Caledonia.

FLOOD SITUATION
BECOMING WORSE
ON MISSISSIPPI

St. Louis, April 5.—The Mississippi
river at St. Louis registered 30.8 feet
at sundown, a rise of .23 since morn-
ing and four-tenths in 24 hours. Un-
less there are heavy rains in this
vicinity within a week the river is
not expected to pass the 31 foot stage.
The flood situation at Caruthers-
ville, Mo., is reported growing more
serious each hour. The river is ris-
ing at the rate of five inches in 24
hours and the stage has passed that
of 1903 by 25 inches.
Every store in the city was closed
today and the men employed in them
joined the already large force of flood
fighters.
No water is in the streets of Car-
uthersville, but the flood from the
Point Pleasant gap is fast filling up
the little river basin several miles
back of the city.
The levee in Caruthersville is the
key to the flood situation of the en-
tire St. Francis Valley. Should a
break occur here, the entire basin,
filled with thickly settled towns,
would be swept by water.

LEAVES FOR SHORT
VACATION IN SOUTH

game of golf. During his absence
Hon. George E. Foster will act as
premier.
