**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**  
The sole head of a family, or any male over 16 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Dues—Six months residence and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. In each of three years after entry the homesteader must cultivate 20 acres of land. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.

Holders of entries may equal time of employment as farm laborers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned entries who have served over one year and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local Agency's Office that not Sub-Agency. Discharge papers must be presented to Agency.
