ROULEAU, *Hon. Mr. Justice* CHARLES BORROMÉE.

Ancestors came from Perche, France, and settled at St. Anne de la Pocatière, P.Q., where the family still own the original property. S. of Joseph Rouleau and Euphrosine Patoile. B. at Isle Verte, Co. of Temiscouata, P.Q., 16 Dec., 1840. Ed. at the Laval Normal Sch., Quebec. M., Elvina, dau. of Hercule Dumouchel, of St. Benoit. Was inspector of the Catholic schools for the Counties of Ottawa and Pontiac for some years. Called to the Bar, P.Q., 16 Dec., 1868. An unsuccessful candidate for local election in the County of Ottawa in 1874. Author of "Notre Systeme Judiciaire," and of a great many articles published in the "Minerve," concerning the judicature in the Province of Quebec; education and several other subjects of public interest. Was District Magistrate for the District of Ottawa from 12 July, 1876 until 28 Sept. 1883, when appointed a Stipendary Magistrate for N.W.T. until 18 February, when appointed a judge of the Supreme Court of the N.W.T. for the judicial District of Northern Alberta. Was *ex-officio* a mem. of the Council. Is now a Legal expert occupying a seat in the Assem.—*Calgary, N. W. T.*

SECORD, JOHN, Q.C. (*South Regina.*)

Of U.E. Loyalist descent. S. of Daniel Secord, formerly of Niagara, and subsequently of Brantford, Ont. B. at Niagara, Ont., 15 April, 1850. Ed. at Brantford High Sch. M., May 1875, Ida May, dau. of John Christopher, of Ingersoll. Admitted as an Attorney, 1871, and called to the Bar, Ont., 1877. Apptd. Q.C. by Dominion Govt. 15 Feb., 1890. Was Town Clerk of Tilsonburg, Ont., for eleven years, and has been Clerk of the City of Regina from its incorporation. Sat in N.W. Council, from 15 Sept., 1885, until its abolition. Elected to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1888. A Liberal Conservative.—*Regina, N. W. T.*
