Was one of the authors of the Programme Catholique, first published April 1871, which was prepared for the purpose of being offered to the Conservative party as a basis on which the several opposing sections of that party, then engaged in a warm contest, might agree. First returned to Parlt. by acclamation at g. e. 1874. Re-elected g. e. 1878, by acclamation at g. e. 1882 and, after at contest, at last g. e.
