

and conveyed the Red River expeditionary field force out from Lake Superior to Fort Garry (now Winnipeg), when all other means of reaching the country to subdue the insurrection had proved unavailing. Was joint Commr., with Lt. Gov. of Manitoba and the Indian Commr. of the North-West, in concluding a treaty with the Salteaux tribe of the Ojibbeway Indians, 1873, Resigned charge of the Dawson Route on becoming a candidate for Algoma, for which he was returned at g.e. for Ont. 1874-5. Resigned his seat in the Leg. Assem., and was returned for the Common at g.e. 1878. Re-elected at g.e. 1882, and again at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Port Arthur; Queen's Hotel, Toronto; Toronto Club.*

DENISON, Lieut. Col. FREDERICK CHARLES, C. M. G. (*West Toronto.*)

Second S. of the late Colonel George Taylor Denison, of Rusholme, Toronto. B. 22 Nov., 1846. Ed. at Upper Can. College. M., 22 April, 1874, Julia, second dau. of the late O. T. Macklem, of Chippewa, Ont. Called to the Bar of Ont., 1870. Was an Alderman of the City of Toronto from 1878 to 1884. Served as a Lieutenant in the Administrative Batt. V.M.; on service at Niagara in 1865, and on 20 Aug. of same year was gazetted Cornet in the Gov. General's Body Guard, in which capacity he served during the Fenian Raid of 1866 on the Niagara Frontier. Served as Orderly Officer to Sir Garnet (now Lord) Wolseley in the Red River expedition of 1870 and was mentioned in despatches. Apptd. Captain in 1872, Major in 1876 and Lieut. Colonel in 1884. Went to Egypt in command of the Canadian *Voyageurs* employed by the Imperial Govt. in the campaign in the Soudan for the relief of General Gordon, and while accompanying General Earle's column, took part in the battle of Kirbekan, (received Egyptian medal and two clasps), was mentioned in despatches by Lord Wolseley and for his services in the campaign was made a C.M.G. Is the author of the *Historical Record of the Governor-General's Body Guard*, and is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Soc. of Eng. First returned to Parl. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Holme House, Rusholme Road, Toronto; Rideau Club.*
