

MUIRHEAD, *Hon.* WILLIAM.

A merchant. Called to L. C., 1867.—*Chatham, N.B.*

PERLEY, *Hon.* CHARLES.

Descended from a loyalist family. B. in Co. Sunbury, N. B. A lumber merchant and agriculturist. Sat for Carleton in N. B. Assembly, previous to the Union. Called to L. C., 1867.—*Woodstock, N.B.*

ROBINSON-OWEN, *Capt. Hon.* JOHN JAMES, *R.N.*

Descended from an old Suffolk family; ancestors were bailiffs and magistrates of Dunwich for some generations. Only s. of Capt. J. Robinson, of H. E. I. C.'s Service. B. at West Ham, Essex, Eng., Jan., 1811. Ed. at the Grammar Schs. of Broxbourne, Hertfordshire, and Ilford, Essex. M., July, 1839, Cornelia, second dau. of Admiral W. F. W. Owen, of Campobello, N. B., and neice of Sir E. W. C. R. Owen, G.C.B., G.C.H. Entered the Royal Navy in 1824, and served until he retired as Captain on half-pay, 1845 (See *Byrne's Naval Biographical Dictionary*). Is an alderman of Dunwich. Was Commissioner of Light-houses, N.B. Assumed the name of "Owen" after that of Robinson, 1869. Sat for Charlotte in N. B. Assembly, from 1850 until apptd. to L.C., 1856.—*Campobello, N. B.; Windlesham House, Surry, Eng.; United Service Club, London, Eng.*

RYAN, *Hon.* JOHN H.

Called to L. C., 1853.—*Studholm, N. B.*

SAUNDERS, *Hon.* JOHN SIMCOE, *Q. C., J. P.*

Only s. of the late Hon. John Saunders, late Chief Justice of N. B., and formerly a Captain of Cavalry in the Queen's Rangers (of which Col. Simcoe was Colonel), by Ariana Margareta
