Anderson, Allan Jardine U.B.C., B.A.Sc., 1923.

196th Battalion, Private, March, 1916. Sergeant, July 1916. England, Nov., 1916.

France, 46th Battalion, Private, April, 1917. Wounded, Oppy, May 6, 1918. Corporal, Aug., 1918. Wounded, Cambrai, Sept. 27, 1918. Canada and discharged, June, 1919.

Anderson, Claude William M.B.C., Sc., 1918-14.

Private, 72nd Battalion.

Son of William and Catherine Anderson. Born at Seattle, Washington, November 17, 1894. Attended public schools at Cascade and Rossland, B. C., King Edward High School, Vancouver, and McGill, B. C., 1913-1914.

He enlisted in July, 1915, with the 72nd Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders of Canada and proceeded overseas with that unit in April of the following year. He went to France with the battalion in August, 1916, and was one of the forty men chosen from the entire unit for its first offensive operation, a raid in the Kemmel sector. He took part in the fighting at Ypres and on the Somme, being conspicuous on patrols throughout the latter operation. He participated in all the trench tours on Vimy Ridge prior to his death.

Private Anderson was mortally wounded during the battle on Vimy Ridge on April 9, 1917, while leading a squad of bombers. For his conduct on this occasion the Military Medal was awarded posthumously.

He died of wounds on April 17, 1917, at Boulogne.

Anderson, David Gash U.B.C., Sc., 1916-18, 19-20.

68th Battery, Canadian Field Artillery, Gunner, Dec., 1917. England, Feb., 1918.

France, 53rd Battery, C.F.A., Driver, Aug., 1918. Canada and discharged, July, 1919.

Anderson, John Alexander M.B.C., U.B.C., Arts, 1918-16.

196th Battalion, Private, March, 1916. England, Nov., 1916. Lieutenant, 16th Canadian Reserve, April, 1917. Royal Flying Corps, 49th Squadron, July, 1917. Crash, Doncaster, Oct. 10, 1917. 1st Canadian Reserve, March, 1919. Canada and discharged, Aug., 1919.
