XVII. And be it enacted, That the said
 5 Company shall forfeit and lose all benefit
 of this charter and the privileges and powers
 hereby conferred, unless the said Harbour
 shall be begun within two years, and com-
 10 pleted within seven years from the passing
 of this Act.

Time limited
 for completion
 of Harbour.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That from and
 after the period when the possession of the
 right, interest and property in and to the
 said Harbour shall have been assumed by
 15 Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors as
 hereinbefore authorised, all tolls and profits
 arising therefrom shall be paid into the hands
 of Her Majesty's Receiver-General to and for
 the public uses of this Province, at the dis-
 20 position of the Legislature thereof; and shall
 be accounted for to Her Majesty, Her Heirs
 and Successors through the Lords Commis-
 sioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in such
 manner and form as Her Majesty, Her Heirs
 25 and Successors shall be graciously pleased to
 direct: Provided always, that the said Har-
 bour shall be commenced within one year
 and completed within seven years after the
 passing of this Act, otherwise this Act and
 30 every matter and thing herein-contained
 shall cease and be utterly null and void.

XIX. And be it enacted, That it shall
 remain in the power of the Legislature to
 make any alterations in the provisions of
 35 this Act, or any additions thereto which may
 seem to them expedient.

XX. And be it enacted, That this shall
 be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and
 as such shall be judicially noticed by all
 40 Judges, Justices of the Peace, and other per-
 sons, without being specially pleaded.
