An Act to establish and continue a Survey in the Township of King, in the County of York.

WHEREAS Joseph Larkin and several others have by their Petition Preamble. shown, that no survey was made by the Crown of lots north of lot number likeen, in the seventh concession of the Township of King, in the County of York, in Upper Canada, to the line between the said

- 5 Cownship and the Township of West Gwillimbury, when the lots in the said concession from the south line of the Township, northerly, to and including the said lot number fifteen, were originally surveyed; that is consequence of there having been no such original survey of the said lots, the settlers then resident in the said seventh concession, about
- 10 twenty-nine years ago, employed George Lount, Esquire, Provincial Land Surveyor, to survey the said concession from the south-cast angle of number sixteen in the said concession, to the north-east angle of number twenty-seven in the same concession, which was the most northerly limit of the settlement in the said concession at that time;
- 15 that a great many of the Petitioners have been settled upon their lots in the said concession for more than thirty years, and since the survey of the said George Lount was made, until the present time, they have Leid their lands according to such survey :--that any alteration in the said survey will create great loss and inconvenience; and that it is
- 50 ation of the like course and line, as the other lots were from sixteen to twenty-seven, as aforesaid; And whereas it is desirable to grant the prayer of their petition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:
- 55 1. The survey so made by the said George Lount, from the south-Lount's sureast angle of lot number sixteen, in the seventh concession of the Town-vey confirmed ship of King, to the north-east angle of number twenty-seven in the said concession, shall be and is hereby established as the only legal and valid survey, and shall be considered to be the true and original
- 60 survey thereof.

2. The survey from the north-east angle of the said lot number Lount's Surtwenty-seven, northerly to the line between the Townships of King and vey to be con-West Gwillimbury, shall be continued in like manner and on the like ^{tinued}: course and line, as between the said lots number sixteen and twenty-

65 seven, and when the same has been continued, such survey shall be deemed to be the only legal and valid survey, and shall be considered to be the true and original survey thereof.
