His second came when he picked off a Thunderbird pass at midfield and rambled 54 yards for the major.
Joe Petrone opened the scoring with a 15 yard filed goal at 9:55 of the first quarter. He converted Louch's first touchdown and kicked a single before the quarter ended, giving the Bears an 11-0 lead.
A two-yard run by Don Tallas gave the Bears their second touchdown pass to Vance Curtis and with three minutes left in the half, Mel Smith swept the right side and scored from seven yards out, leaving the halftime score
