 I am in Receipt of your favour
 of the 28th ultimo and in Reply. I made
 it my Business to call upon the Indians
 and Enquire into the actual Condition of
 the Block of Land that the prayers of
 their petition amounted to In the
 first place they had settled upon Lots
 No 3. 6. 7 upon the 11th Range Rowdon
 and did not know that No 3 was a large
 Reserve Therefore they are satisfied to take
 the Block that the following Lots will
 Contain that is to say No 6. & 7 upon 11th R.
 Rowdon No 6. & 7 upon the first R.
 Chortsey, No 6. & 7 upon the second R.
 2nd - No 6. & 7 upon the third R.
 2nd -

In this Block there is now squatters
 settled thereon but the Indians - Except as
 trotting Canadians Carpenter of the name
 of Mr Caboy that the Indians gave
 him liberty to erect a cabin this Winter.

Michel Nicolas and his Brother
 John the Chief petitioners for this Block
 of Land would be thankful to the
 Commissioners of Crown Lands not allow
 their Lots that they have cleared upon to
 pass into any other hands but their
 own as they have been at a great Expence
 upon the Lots No 6 & 7 upon the 11th Range
 Rowdon
