

Colonel Vanier was born in Montreal, educated at Loyola, Laval University and the Staff College, Camberlay; and called to the Montreal Bar in 1911. He served with the 22nd Battalion (1915-1919); was A.D.C. to the Governor-General 1921-22, and 1926-28, and commanded the Royal 22nd Regiment 1925-28. He was appointed to a post in the Canadian Office at Geneva in 1928, and Secretary of the Office of the High Commissioner in London in 1931. He has represented the Canadian Government on many imperial and international bodies.

Mr. Jean Desy was educated at Laval University, l'Ecole Libre des Sciences Politiques and the Sorbonne. He was admitted to the Quebec Bar, and was appointed Professor of International and Constitutional Law in the University of Montreal in 1919. In 1925 he was appointed Counsellor in the Department of External Affairs and in 1928 was transferred in the same capacity to the Canadian Legation in Paris. He has represented the Canadian Government in many conferences, and has acted as Charge d'Affaires at Paris on various occasions.

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
