Reactions to questioning show that widespread and common reasons for which many in Quebec want to vote against the Liberals are:

(1) Among the French

- (a) Canada is doing too much in this war and the Liberals alone are responsible.
- (b) The King Government has sold Canada down the river to Britain and put Canada second in many ways.
- (c) The war taxation is anti-social - exemptions for children and dependents are insufficient (The Bloc is cashing in heavily on this).
- (d) The war taxation is unjust because the incidence of income taxation places the biggest taxes on families with the heaviest load of dependents (the Bloc is doing damage with a tabulation published in the Financial Post in 1942).
- (e) The King Government has been a traitor on conscription.
- (f) In the plebiscite, Quebec voted No, and isn't going to vote Yes for the benefit of the party which monkeyed with the Mobilization Act.

(2) Among the English

- (a) The manpower muddle.
- (b) No outright conscription.
- (c) The Government is too pro-British; too un-Canadian.
- (d) No clear-cut declarations on private enterprise in post-war Canada, whereas Churchill and Roosevelt have said where they are going.
- (e) No clear-cut declaration about Canada's post-war role and fear that Canadians will, under King, have to play Santa Claus to other nations - again do too much, again be used by Britain.
- (f) Strong resentment by women at holes in price ceilings - "there seems to be a ceiling on everything except what I want".
- (g) Charges by mothers that the children have not been put up front in food programmes - in Britain they have. Resentment at national food campaigns promoting use of foods either too dear or too rare.
