MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRIME MINISTER

Sir Campbell Stuart is in town this week. He arrived, unannounced, to discuss cable and wireless questions. You will recall that the United Kingdom Government, some weeks ago, cancelled his plans for paying a visit to Washington, feeling that telecommunications questions would shortly have to be discussed directly between the United Kingdom and United States Governments, and that an advance visit to Washington by Sir Campbell Stuart might only confuse further the complicated situation. Stuart is, therefore, not going to Washington, but is planning to go to New York to discuss plans with private American Companies. He is meeting with our Interdepartmental Committee on Telecommunications on Friday morning. The meeting has been arranged solely in order to give him an opportunity to explain his views on the telecommunications setup.
