The most important Canadian amendment adopted called for the establishment of a Consolidated Revenue Fund.

- 5. Working Capital Fund. The scale of contributions to the Working Capital Fund, which is intended to finance operations pending presentation of the first regular budget, was an average between the F.A.O. scale for the first and second financial years. The amount set was \$25,000,000 to be paid immediately.
- 6. Emoluments of Judges of the International Court of Justice.

- 7. Advisory Group. The Committee approved the Preparatory Commission's recommendation that an Advisory Group of Experts be appointed to assist the Secretary General pending establishment of the Advisory Committee on budgetary and administrative questions.
- Secretary General was provided with an annual retiring allowance of \$10,000 per annum payable after his retirement. The retirement scheme for other officials of the United Nations is technical and is contained in Mr. Jones' report.
- 9. The General Framework of the Secretariat. The general framework as proposed in the Preparatory Commission's Report was adopted. In addition, the setting up of a Department of Public Information was also approved.
- 10. Budget. The budget scheme presented by the Advisory Group of Experts amounted to nearly \$25,000,000. This was attacked by the Soviet delegation as too high, and while the sum appeared to the Canadian delegation as not unreasonable, it was
