What can a boy think when his father chides him for wearing his hat in the house at the same time that he has his own on? What can a boy think, when he hears his father curse and swear, and use obscene language continually in the house—or what a boy can imagine, when he sees his father come staggering home with all the majesty of drunkennels from the tavern, where he has been not only offering up a copious libation at the shrine of Bacchus, but perhaps has been engaged in its concomitant vices, such as gaming, &c. This is too frequent-
