

*Again.* What is the value of 36 bushels and 19 pounds of barley at 65 cents per bushel?

Look at the *left* of No. 36, under the price "65 cents per bushel," and you have \$23-40, and at the *right* of No. 19 you have 20 cents, which, added to \$23-40, makes \$23-60, the sum sought.

**NOTE.**—The value of pounds in these tables is computed at 30 pounds to the bushel. Consequently, for Barley, Rye, Corn, &c., you must add the following per cent. to the value in the tables.

For Corn add  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the value of the pounds to the answer in the table for the *true* answer for Corn.

For Rye, where Rye is measured at 56 lbs. per bushel, add  $\frac{1}{5}$  the same as before.

For Barley and Buckwheat, add  $\frac{1}{4}$  for the *true* value.
