The book, like its predecessors, will aid greatly in keeping the young people of the church in touch with its mission work.

No native of the Green Isle needs to be told that the "little people" are the ancient inhabitants of the country, who come out of their under-earth abodes only at night, vanishing, at the first streak of dawn, to their hiding places in caves or clefts of the rock. In, Little People (Cassell & Company, Toronto, 295 pages, \$1.80), Richard Whiteing, the well known novelist, takes these creatures of the Irish fancy as types of "the quiet folk who form the vast majority of our kind" and writes a couple of dozen charming essays, hitting off the character and doings of as many representatives of that large class. Such chapter headings as, The Ratepayer, Little People in Politics, Little People in Love, Little Great People, etc., afford glimpses of the pleasantly entertaining paths along which the author invites us to walk with him.

In, Canadian Hymns and Hymn-Writers, the series of articles, by Rev. A. Wylie Mahon, B.D., St. Andrews-by-the-Sea, which first appeared in East and West, have been issued in an artistic booklet. Mr. Mahon writes with an exquisite touch, and his little volume is full of interesting information. (William Briggs, Toronto, 56 pages, 35c.).

Concerning the Christ, by J. D. Freeman, M.A., formerly pastor of Bloor Street Baptist Church, Toronto (Willian Briggs, Toronto, 241 pages, 75c.), is a series of 'word pictures from the Life of lives.

Readers of Mr. Freeman's delightful exposition of the Shepherd Psalm, in, Life on the Uplands, will find in this new book the same limpid style and deep spiritual appreciation as in that earlier volume. There is a rare winsomeness in the presentation of the gracious and mighty Christ found in these pages.

The latest volume in, Bible Lessons for Schools, by Miss E. M. Knox, Principal of Havergal College, Toronto, is, **The Acts of the Apostles** (The Macmillan Company of Canada, Toronto, 401 pages, 70c. net, postage 5c.). This is a book by a skilled and practical teacher, primarily for teachers, but helpful also to older pupils. It divides the Acts into fifty Lessons, thus laying out a convenient course for virtually a year of weekly studies. The comments on each of the Lessons are readable and instructive.

The Annual Volumes for 1908 of **Chums** (\$1.75) and **Little Folks** (\$1.25), published by Cassell & Co., Toronto and London, are fully up to the high standard of literary and artistic merit set in previous years.
