The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR lays before His Majesty's Council the Copy of a Despatch which he has received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, upon the subject of erecting Light-Houses on the Islands of Scattarie and St. Paul. The Lieutenant-Governor feels assured that the liberality of the Parent Government, in undertaking the erection of Light-Houses on those Islands, will be met with a corresponding feeling by His Majesty's Council and the House of Assembly.

A Bill, entitled, An Act to continue the Act in addition to, and in amendment of, the Act to prevent Nuisances by Hedges, Wears and other Incumbrances, obstructing the passage of Fish in the Rivers of this Province.

A Bill, entitled, An Act to continue the Act to provide against the occurrence of Diseases from the Bite of Animals.

A Bill, entitled, An Act to continue an Act in amendment of certain Acts relating to Wills, Legacies and Executors, and for the Settlement and Distribution of the Estates of Intestates.

The said Bills were severally read a first time.

Ordered, That the continuing Bills be referred to Mr. Binney, Mr. McNab and Mr. Allison, to examine and report upon.
