"An Act to enable the Province Treasurer to borrow the sum of Nine "Thousand Pounds, for paying off Bounties and other Debts, payable by the "Laws of this Province."

" An act to regulate the exportation of Lumber, and to repeal all the Acts "now in force relating to the same.

"An Act in addition to and amendment of an Act, intituled " an Act for the support and relief of Confined Debtors," and the Act further to extend the provisions thereof.

" An Act to regulate the exportation of Fish, and to repeal the Laws now in "force relating thereto.

"An Act further to alter and extend the provisions of an Act, intituled" an "Act to encourage the erection of a Passage-Boat to be worked by steam, for "facilitating the communication between the City of Saint John and Frederic-"ton, and to give further encouragement to the present Proprietors of the "Steam Passage-Boat erected in pursuance of the same Act."

" An Act to prevent Desertion from His Majesty's Forces, and to punish " unlawful dealings with Soldiers or Deserters.

" An Act to explain and amend an Act, intituled " an Act to impose a duty " upon certain articles imported into this Province."

" An Act to regulate the Herring Fisheries in the Parishes of West-Isles, "Campo-Bello, Pennfield, and St. George, in the County of Charlotte.

" An Act for laying a duty on all Teas imported into this Province.

" An Act to amend and continue an Act, intituled " an Act for raising a "Revenue in this Province."

" An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein, "mentioned."

His Excellency was also pleased to reserve "a Bill to extend the provisions "of an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "an "Act for establishing a Grammar School in the Town of St. Andrew's," for further consideration.

After which, His Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech to both Houses :---

" Gentlemen of the Council,

1

" and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

" Having passed such Bills of the present Session as have been agreed to, " with one exception. I have only to express my hopes that the Acts may prove " advantageous to the interests of the Province.

" Gentlemen of the Assembly,

" It is with regret that I have to remark, that hardly any provision has been "made for those services which have been particularly recommended by me "to your consideration.

"And it is with great concern that I notice your persistence in a measure to which your attention has been very recently called---which conduct I can-

" not suffer to pass unnoticed, consistent with the duty I owe to my Sovereign " The only mode which you have now left me to do this, is by dissolving " this General Assembly."

The Honourable Judge Saunders then, by command of His Excellency the Licutenant-Governor, said---

" Gentlemen of the Council,

" and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

" It is His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor's will and pleasure that this "General Assembly be dissolved---and this General Assembly is dissolved ac-"cordingly."
