CAP. XIV.

An Act to prevent disorderly Riding, and to regulate the driving of Carriages on the STREETS and Public Boans.

[April 7th, 1838.] .

E it enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after Persons not to the publication of this Act, it shall not be lawful for ride at full speed, any person to ride at full speed, or gallop any Horse, Street of any Mare, Gelding, Mule or Ass, on any Street in any Town in this island. of the Towns within this Island.

II. And be it enacted, That each and every per-Regulates the son who shall hereafter drive any Truck, Sled or driving of Trucks &c. for the car-Wheel Carriage, used for the carriage of Goods, riage of Goods within the Town of Charlottetown, or any other in this Island. Town within this Island, shall not, on any pretence whatever, drive swifter than a slow or, easy trot; and shall at all times take care to lead his, her or their Horse or Horses, with a halter, or to guide them with proper reins.

III. And be it enacted, That all and every per-Regulates the son or persons who shall hereafter drive any Sleigh, sleighs, sec. or any Truck, Cart, Chaise, or other Wheel Car-within any Town riage whatsoever, within any Town, or on any of way. the Highways in this Island, shall drive the same in a moderate and careful manner.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall not Persons travelbe lawful for any person or persons, travelling with Sleds not to suiter empty Sleds, to suffer pointed Stakes to remain pointed stakes, &c. to remain standing, or carry frames, or projecting pieces, outside of the said Sled.
