nada, the sum of Thirteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-four Pounds. Nineteen Shillings and Three Farthings, has been issued and advanced by Your Majesty, through Your said Lieutenant Governor, to the Clerks, and other Officers of the two Houses of Parliament, to enable them to pay the Contingent Expenses of the First and Second Sessions of the present Parliament: We, Your Majesty's dutiful and loval Subjects, the Commons of Upper Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, do therefore humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted. And be it enacted, by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled. "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That out of the fund or funds subject to the £13,864 19 04, granted. disposition of the Parliament of this Province, now remaining in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there shall be issued and applied the sum of Thirteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-four Pounds, Nineteen Shillings and Three Farthings, to make good the said sum so issued and advanced as aforesaid.

CHAP. LXII.

AN ACT granting a certain sum of money to defray the expenses of the Civil Government, for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-eight, and for other purposes therein-mentioned.
