Clabon will take place this morning at 11 o'clock in front of the registry of the supreme court on South Lincoln street. Yesterday Judge Spinks granted the customary order stopping the sale on the condition that security for the amount of the judgment and the costs be deposited by the defendant, Mr. Scott, with the registrar of the court. Up to the present time Mr. Scott has not given the security, and this morning at 11 o'clock Sheriff Robinson will in all probability offer the stock for sale in accordance with the writ of execution secured by the plaintiff, Clabon.
