MADE MANY

Artist A. W. Fleming Returns From Ireland and Scotland

Talks to The Planet About His Trip-Interesting Notes

Artist A. M Fleming, of this city, who for the past four and one-half mouths has been on a sketching four through Ireland and Scotland, has returned home.

Mr. Fleming states that his trip was a most pleasant and profitable, one. The weather in the Old Country has been very wet and cold all summer, and as a result the crops are not very good. Cutting oats and trying to eure hay in the month of October is very uncommon work, but such is the case in Scotland and Ireland this year. The people feared land this year. The people feared that the crops would not ripen and in many places the oats were still quite green when Mr. Fleming left the country. The crops, however, were being cut, and it was the intention of the farmers to cure the grain for feed.

grain for feed.

Speaking of the great dock laborers' strike, Mr. Fleming stated that he was present when the strike was at its worst in Belfast. Lines of soldiers paraded the streets, and sometimes found it necessary to separate the mob at the point of their bayoners. Stones sticks brick-rick. their bayone's. Stones, sticks, brick-bats, etc., were hurled on all sides, and people were continuously being hurt. Fassengers were escorted into the boats under the protection of soldiers, and the whole city was in an uprogr.

an uproar.

The International Exhibition at Dublin was not a success financially, although Mr. Fleming says that the exhibits were excellent. The bad weather was the cause of the scant crowds. The Canadian exhibit was a creditable one, and was among the a creditable one, and was among the fareign exhibits. It was a creditable one, and was among the best of the foreign exhibits. It was generally commented upon as being one of the finest ever seen at an exhibition of this kind.

In reference to subjects for painting, etc., he stated that he had seen and taken hundreds of sketches, comprising some of the most beautiful coast scenes, mountain scenery and all kinds of interior landscapes. He visited nearly all the large cities and towns in Ireland and Scotland, among which he especially mentioned Eduborough and Glasgow as being the places of the greatest interest. In Glasgow he met and spent seven, weeks with the famous artist, Andrew Black, of the Royal Scottish Water Colors Society. He visited this gentleman's studio, and viewed many very fine paintings. Mr Fleming states that he visited the Land of Burns in every available corner. He toured the Highlands, enjoyed himself to the fullest extent among the hills and mountains. In the New Hebrides Mountains he made several sketches, one in particular, being the Isle of Aaron. He traversed Loch Lomond, and also climed the highest point in Great Britain, which is Ben Nevis. which is 4.406 feet above the Nevis, which is 4,406 feet above the sea level. Snow is falling there almost continually, and snowballing can be indusged in all year. From this height a magnificent view of Scotland can be had. The Scottish lakes can be seen for a distance of

Scotland can be had. The Scotlish lakes can be seen for a distance of fifty miles, and Ireland, across the Irish Sea, can be plainly seen on a clear day. Ben Nevis is near fort William on the Caledonia Canal.

"I also had the pleasure of seeing the magnificent steamer Lusitannia while at the Clyde Banks," said Mr. Fleming "This is where she was built. The river at Liverpool had to be dredged in order to let her in, as well as the landing place at New York, U. S. A.
