RETAIL PRICES FOR SALE OF LIQUOR

The government executive held sessions Thursday morning and afternoon.

At the morning meeting the Water Power Commission was heard regarding the extension of a transmission line from the Neptune to Newcastle. It was decided that work should start next week.

The Intoxicating Liquor Commission was also heard and a schedule of prices will be issued at once, as the profits of the retailers have been decided upon. The commission is now operating fully.

CIRCUS CROOKS

A correspondent of the Truro, N. S. News in writing of the Circus which lately visited that town says: "Some enjoyed the show but had the amusement taken from the circus through the clever crooked methods of followers. Many were 'stung to a greater or lesser amount of cash. Not through the many chance games pursued, but apparently by some of the officials of the show. One notable mean trick was perpetrated by one who professed to be selling Reserved Seat tickets at the entrance of the Main Show tent. Asking patrons to give him paper money for silver, he in every case succeeded in doing the obliging citizen out of a dollar or two. There were many other schemes to rob the unwary."

"Now that the Government takes all the cream in the shape of license war-tax, etc. from the towns, which suffer from the visit of these travelling shows, it is up to the Nova Scotia authorities to at once take steps to put a stop to the wholesale robberies committed at circus performances. Unless the management safely can guarantee safety for the public a license should be refused. The guarantee protected by a deposit of a large sum of money, which will be refunded should the show leave the province without any robberies having been committed by followers. References is not being made to the chance games. If a patron gets stung playing cards or meddling with dice he deserves it; but when wrong change is given by pickpockets, the management should be held responsible."

Every circus which tours the eastern provinces has its short change artists who operate inside of the tent, where they appear to be safe from police interference. They have an unlimited supply of silver and they have no difficulty in finding plenty of suckers ready to do business with them. They manage to steal two dollars out of every five and get away with it. If the authorities when a circus comes to town would get after the short change artists in dead earnest they would soon put them out of business.

DOCTOR SCORES MEDICAL SYSTEM

Halifax, N. S. July 5 - That the present system of medical education in vogue in the colleges is turning out occasionally "bedside incompetents" and is not conducive to the best interests of the professions in the Dominion, was the keynote of the presidential address delivered by Dr. Marjorie Chisholm, of Halifax, at the plenary meeting which formally opened the 22nd second annual convention of the Canadian Medical Association here tonight.

Dr. Chisholm deprecated the present day tendency to "specialize" to extremes and suggested that medical students spent far too much time on subjects which were little or no use to the practicing physician. Vigorous applause from the three hundred delegates and a large number of citizens who attended the meeting greeted the remarks.

WILL WALK FROM MONTREAL TO HALIFAX

MONTREAL, July 5 - Jack Behan and Frank Dill, two of the five transcontinental hikers who recently completed a walk across the continent from Halifax to Vancouver and who have been for the past few days in Montreal for a walking match from Montreal to Halifax, a distance of 756 miles. The race will start at ten o'clock on Thursday morning and will be for a purse of \$1,000, put up by the Halifax Herald and divided into a first prize of \$600 and a second prize of \$400.

The contestants will follow the C. P. R. tracks and will endeavor to help out their expenses by selling post card photographs of themselves as they did on the Halifax-Vancouver hike.

Clifford Behan, a third hiker, was released from the general hospital today, but is too weak to enter the race. Charles Burkman and Mrs. Dill, the other transcontinental hikers, are still in Montreal, but say they have had enough of hiking. They decline to enter the contest, but will be on hand to give the two challengers a send-off and hope to be present to welcome them on their arrival in Halifax.

Reports from District Agricultural Representatives state that prospects for hay are very bad, indications pointing to a seventy-five per cent. crop. Grass pasture greatly in need of rain. Fruit prospects only fair, strawberries in particular being very few.

Tent Caterpillars have done much damage to fruit trees. In some Northern sections the cut-worms have attacked grain fields and caused serious loss.

Potato fields show a large percentage of missing hills. The indications are that Potato and Flea beetles will be more numerous and more destructive this year than for many years.
