A TRAGEDY AT QUAPPELLE

Qu'Appelle, Feb. 14.—One morning recently Mr. Bushell of the Leland was aroused by loud knocking at his door. On opening it he found Geo. Wilson an employee of the firm, half clothed and in an almost insensible condition. Mr. Wilson urged his employer to go to the stable where the machine used to find him already dead. The rooms are heated with a coal stove and during the night the gas had escaped asphyxiating McCallum and rendering Wilson almost unconscious.

Deceased was a young Scotchman, about 25 years old. He and two brothers have been in the country several years. The brothers reside in the Edinburgh district and have been notified of the sad accident.

Wilson is now under the doctor's care and will recover.

DR. DUVAL MODERATOR

Portage La Prairie, Feb. 14.—At the meeting of the Portage La Prairie presbytery here yesterday, Dr. Duval of Winnipeg, was chosen moderator. Rev. G. W. Barton, of Austin, tendered his resignation of that pulp and the matter will be considered at the next meeting of the presbytery. Delegates were appointed to the General assembly.

ST. ANDREW'S LOCKS

Winnipeg, Feb. 14.—Messrs. Quintan and Ebert, the new contractors for the construction of the St. Andrew's locks, are getting everything in readiness for energetically pushing forward that work as soon as the spring opens. Several new buildings for offices and other purposes are being erected, and more are in contemplation. A large force of teams are also at work drawing sand and gravel for use in concrete work. About 50,000 cubic yards of gravel will be required and it is the aim of the contractors to have about a quarter of this on the ground before the breaking up of the road. A gang of men are also busy clearing out the lock pit.

MEXICO LOWERS TARIFF

Ottawa, Feb. 14.—The Canadian commercial agent in the city of Mexico wires today that the duty on wheat is reduced from February 15th to June 30th from 67.9 per 100 pounds to 33.9 per hundred.

FAMINE ADDED TO REVOLUTION

London, Feb. 14.—A deficiency of 662,000,000 bushels of grain in Russia presages a serious state of affairs throughout the empire. Famine is staring the people in the face and becoming very acute. The deficiency will have to be made up by importation.

THE FAMINE IN RUSSIA

The famine in Russia will reach an acute stage now on and the probability that Russia will cease to be an exporter of wheat during the present and the next year's crop has drawn renewed attention to the Canadian North-West as a factor in supplying the Russian deficiency. During the last famine in 1891 wheat was some 20 cents a bushel higher than at present. At that time American exports of wheat and corn doubled. This year crops in Russia show a decline of 662,000,000 bushels in these grains. The decrease in Russia '07, by comparison with the crop of 1904 the decrease in the four leading grains was 662,000,000 bushels. The question whether the United States and Canada can during the remainder of this year's crop and the coming one, supply this deficiency. The outlook for the Canadian North-West farmers under the circumstances is the most promising for years.

CHEMICAL FIRE IN TORONTO

Toronto, Feb. 13.—A twenty-five thousand dollar fire occurred on the premises of the E. B. Shuttleworth Chemical Co. early last afternoon. It started somewhere in the basement, but the officials of the company are unable to give an idea of its origin.

DIAMONDS COME VERY HIGH

St. Paul, Minn., Feb. 14.—Messrs. Greensgard, of Willow City, N.D., have come to believe that the term "black diamonds" as applied to coal is by no means a misnomer. Running short of fuel during the fuel famine which afflicted the northern part of the State of Dakota, and being unable to secure any in the vicinity, they each ordered 600 pounds to be shipped by express from the head of the lakes. The North Lake Coal Co., of Duluth, filled the order and it is estimated that the coal cost the Greensgards at the rate of \$56 a ton.

ANOTHER LAURIER NOMINATED

Montreal, Feb. 14.—Dr. R. C. Laurier, a young Montreal physician, was today chosen by the Liberals of L'Assomption for the seat in the House of Commons, vacated by the death of Charles Laurier, foster brother to Sir Wilfrid. The candidate is a second cousin of the premier.

LESLIE BRIDGE REPAIRED

Leedsbridge, Feb. 14.—Two important

HOME RULE AT LAST

London, Feb. 14.—In the debate on the address in reply to the speech from the throne in the House of Commons today Walter Hume Long, at one time chief secretary for Ireland, raised the Irish question and Augustus Birrell, the present chief secretary, replied that, like Premier Campbell-Bannerman, was perfectly satisfied that the only solution satisfactory to the great majority of the Irish people was that which is generally called the home rule bill, and that neither he nor the premier would assume the responsibility for any measure likely to obstruct or interfere with the fulfillment of those hopes. This statement was greeted with loud ministerial and nationalist cheers.

LUMBER ASSOCIATION PROPOSED

Vancouver, Feb. 14.—The formation of an association having for its object the conserving and promoting of timber interests in the province, is being actively pushed by a number of lumbermen. The association is being formed among the timber-owners, millmen, loggers, and other persons who are interested in the industry. The object of the association is to secure for the movement the cooperation of all interested parties. The association will be formed at a meeting to be held in Vancouver on the 20th inst.

DYMENT WAS RICH

EXPERIMENTAL FOR BOSTEREN

Boston, Feb. 14.—The Boston delegation to Ottawa returned here last night. While in the capital they interviewed Hon. Sydney Fisher, minister of agriculture; Hon. Frank Oliver, minister of interior; Senator Davis and G. E. McCreary,

M.P. Mr. Fisher promised consideration of their request for an experimental farm located at Rosthern. The Dominion authorities were also quite willing to throw open the reserves north of here if the Indians could be persuaded to leave.

LAMONT HAS A GRIEVANCE

Lamont, Feb. 14.—The people of Lamont feel they have a grievance against the C. N. R., as the company has paid no attention to their petitions for a station. One firm here has shipped out \$100,000 worth of produce, and this is the distributing centre for a large stretch of country; yet no relief to our railway difficulty seems in sight. Apparently, people here, the only remedy lies in preparing a case and appealing to the railway commission.

CITY ELECTRICIAN'S REPORT

The city electrician's report for the month of January, which is just out today, shows a remarkable growth of the city's service, considering that January was the record cold month of Edmonton's history. The electrician reports that there were 62 applications for light, representing 479 lights; 21 additional lights added on old services, 51 new lighting services. During January there were five motors installed, as follows: Cushing Bros.
