ALLAN LINER GRAMPAN RAN ON ROCKS IN RIVER

The Grampian Went Hard Aground at Cap La Roche at Low Tide—Fastest of Regular Courses, When Accident Occurred.

Montreal, May 10.—The first accident of the St. Lawrence navigation season took place at Cap La Roche, forty miles above Quebec, when at noon the Allan liner Grampian ran on the rocks.

SIR JOHN FRENCH TO ATTEND CALGARY CAMP

Distinguished Soldier Will Arrive in That City from Ottawa to Inspect the Provincial Encampment on June 18th—The Edmonton 18th Mounted Rifles Will Be in Attendance.

Calgary, May 9.—Lieut.-Gen. Sir John French, inspector-general of the British Imperial army, and Inspector-General Sir Percy Lake of the Canadian militia, will arrive here from Ottawa, June 23, to inspect the annual district encampment beginning in Calgary, June 15.

Lieut.-Gen. French is a distinguished cavalry officer before being advanced to his present rank, and was commander of the cavalry division under Lord Roberts at the relief of Kimberley and the capture of Cronje's army at Paardeberg.

The encampment will last twelve days. It will be held on the Industrial school grounds. One of the features of the camp will be the organization of a brigade formed out of the various troops in the district.

In the Fifteenth Light Horse there are 23 officers, 200 men, and 270 horses, and in the Nineteenth Mounted Rifles and the Twenty-third Alberta Rifles, there are 21 officers, 158 men, and 149 horses.
