
Saved From Drowning by J. J. Brown of Torbay.

He was very weak from exhaustion and the salt water he had swallowed, also from a dislocated shoulder which h eceived in his fall from the dock. No doctor was needed to revive him. Th fingers of a fisherman slipped his shoulder in place, and by 3 o'cloc yesterday afternoon he was walking up Thames Street as though he had never fallen overboard in his life.
