Cable News

C. E. F. CASUALTIES.

OTTAWA, Aug. 30.
There were 471 casualties in today's list of which 86 were killed in action, 23 died of wounds, 8 died, 25 presumed to have died, four wounded and missing, one missing, believed killed, 20 missing, 13 ill, 137 wounded, 51 gassed and two prisoners of war.

"A PAINFUL SETBACK."

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 30.
Commenting on the German withdrawal from the Frankfurt Zeitung finds comfort in the assurance that a short defence line will require fewer reserves, but it acknowledges that the retirement "means a painful setback." It declares that the surrender of Ror, which is a mere heap of ruins was unimportant from a military point of view.

Court Returns.

Hon. Mr. Justice Johnson, and the members of the western circuit returned to town by yesterday's noon train, the final sitting having taken place at Placentia on Thursday. No criminal business came before the court, but several civil matters were handled. A large number of applications for exemption came before the Judge, while acting as a military tribunal. Those attending the circuit were Messrs. W. J. Carroll, sub-sheriff; D. J. Kent, clerk; John Cahill, crier. The lawyers attending were Messrs. C. E. Hunt, E. Leo Carter and C. J. Fox.

The northern circuit opens next week at Tilt Cove, Hon. Justice Kent being the presiding Judge.
