The report of the Postmaster General's remainder the past year, presents some very interesting details, and exhibits very satisfactory statistics respecting the general progress of the whole cosmunity. The Post Office, as yet, is scarcely a self sustaining institution in this country, but, from the figures supplied to us by the resport for the year under consideration, it will becore account to believe that it will becore account to believe that it will becore account to be past year was \$1,193.062; the expenditure being \$1,360.062; the expendi

In the returns of the Money order and Savings Bank department, we ind very satisfactory evidence of their constantly increasing usefulness. Last year the total issue of money orders reached the handsome agure of \$5,114,831,31, shewing an increase over the former year of \$55,500. The money order system appears to be entirely self-sustaining in Ontario and Quebec. In the Savings Bank Reportment an increase of 4,523 is shown in the number of transactions, while in the amount placed to the credit of depositors the increase is, in round numbers, \$600, 0.00.

Coming nearer home, to Guelph itself, we find that the gioss revenues for the office here, during the past year, was \$5,023.91, including inverse. The expenditure for salaries, allowance for Forward duty, for rent, fuel, and light, amounted to \$2,865.50, exclusive of a sum of \$47. 85 for advertising unchained letters, &c. The expenditure for mail transportation amounted to \$2,130. It will be seen, then, that on the whole the fostmaster General's respect for the past year is an emmently satisfactory one, and we think that all the officers connected with the department are to be congratulated on the very satisfactory manner in which the business of the Post Office has been conducted.
