Washington, D. C., Aug. 17.—In the House of Representatives yesterday the Anti-Lottery Bill was taken up. Mr. Wilkinson, of Louisiana, in supporting the measure, admitted the pollution which the Louisiana Lottery had wrorght upon his State, but attributed the birth of that pollution to the days of reconstruction. The people of Louisiana looked with gladness to the time when lotteries would be prohibited in that State. But the revenue to the State had been too great to be resisted without a straggle. When the Louisiana Legislature met, the very elements themselves had conspired to give the Louisiana Lottery Company a charter. The floods had borne down from the north and west.
