The German steamship, "City of New York," will be the largest vessel afloat, and is, her kind, intended to be the fastest. To present the "Umbria," the "Burgoyne" and the "Lahn" may be regarded as typical of the highest development of the combined art of the ship-builder and the engineer. But the new grade of vessels, which the "City of New York" is the pioneer, will be, on the average, fifty per cent longer than the largest of those now running, and is expected to be the longest record yet made by ten or twenty feet.
