KOCH'S SECRET DIVULGED.

THE LYMPH IS GLYCERINE AND EXTRACT OF TUBERCLE BACILLI.
Describing the Treatment of the Patients Upon Whom He has Operated During the Past Three Months and the Effect of His Discovery Upon these Diseases. An Interesting Document.

BERLIN, Jan. 15.—The secret of the ingredients entering into the composition of Prof. Koch's lymph is given to the world to-day. Prof. Koch's lymph is a mixture of glycerine and extract of tubercle bacilli. The remedy which is used in the new treatment consists of a glycerine extract derived from the pure cultivation of tubercle bacilli. Into the simple extract there is naturally passed the extract of the tubercle bacilli, besides the effective substance, all the other matter soluble in 20 per cent glycerine. Consequently it contains a certain quantity of mineral salts, coloring substances and other known extractive matter. Some of these substances can be removed from it with tolerable ease.

The effective substance itself is insoluble in absolute alcohol. It can be precipitated by it not indeed in a condition of perfect purity, but when still combined with other extractive matter. The coloring matter may also be removed so as to render it possible to obtain from the extract a colorless dry substance. This substance is a mixture of glycerine and tubercle bacilli. It is a much more concentrated form than original glycerine solutions. For application in practice, the purification of glycerine extract would be of no advantage because the substances so eliminated are not essential for the human organism. The purification process would make the cost of remedy very early high. Regarding the constitution of Koch's lymph, it is a mixture of glycerine and tubercle bacilli.
