JOHNSON, SANGER AND TYLER.

A Match Race for the Island Track on Dominion Day—Fine, Fast Professionals.

Johnson, Sanger and Tyler will open their season as professional riders on the Ferry Company's track at Hurler's Point on Dominion Day, in a three-cornered contest. The Ferry race Association outbid all rivals, including Waltham and many other places, that they decided to race for the Ferry Association's purse of \$1000, mile heats, best two in three, 5 furlongs, 10 furlongs, and Waltham, the Buffalo pro, will race the riders on a tandem; and later on in the program the pair will race Johnson for a mile in an effort to lower the world's record for a quarter mile track. As everybody knows, Johnson presently is the champion of the world, as Zimmerman recently relinquished the title. With Tyler, he holds nearly all the world's records, and both are said to be going faster than ever this year. Walter Sanger is the big class B man of a year ago, who was second only to Johnson in the program. The pair will race Johnson for a mile in 58.1 seconds, beating the world's record.

Beides the best race, the fine professionals will ride in half mile open and mile handicap races. The racing will start at 3.30.
