


ALL SAINTS' CHURCH WILL MARK 18TH ANNIVERSARY

Special Choral Numbers and Outstanding Sermons Will Be Given To-Morrow



PASTOR DEFENDS MODERN NOVEL

Declared More Wholesome Than Old-Fashioned Books KANSAS CITY, Mo., Oct. 30.—The old-fashioned novel, in which the impeccable hero always married the decorous heroine and lived happily ever after, was far more wholesome in its way than the sex-ridden fiction of to-day, in the opinion of Dr. L. M. Birkhead, pastor of All Souls' Unitarian Church here.

Dr. Birkhead, who is conducting a lecture course in his church on the relation of the new psychology to literature, vigorously defends present-day fiction. He says the prudish, over-sentimental novel of the past has been responsible for much maladjustment in marriage.
