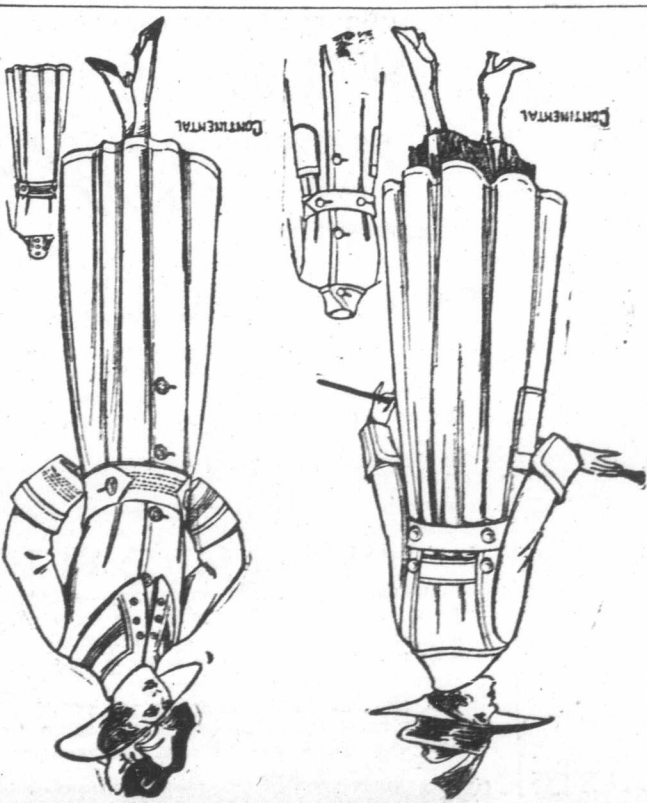


Our Ladies' Coats
