To-day the Wheat market still showed signs of decline, and upwards of 4,000 bshls changed hands at \$1 20, that being the current figure of the day-the range extending from that to \$1 16. The average price for the day was \$1 19 per bushel. There has not been much buoyancy on the market. Barley-was very active although a little easier at 65 to 71c, the current rate being 70c per bushel. Spring Wheat—was hardly so brisk, and \$1 was the prevalent figure for the ordi ary sample. Peas—in good request at 60 to 63c, sometimes 65c per bush. Oats—are steady at 25 to ooc per bush. Other things are unchanged.
