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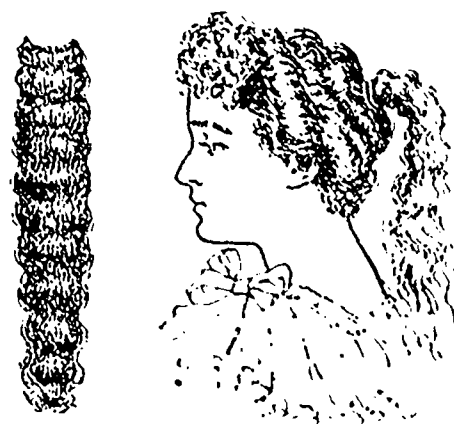

- JANUARY
1. Annual Report of the Department, due. (Not later than 1st January.)
 2. Clerk of Municipalities to be notified by Separate School Trustees of their withdrawal. (P. S. Act, sec. 17 (1).) (Before 2nd Wednesday in January.)
 3. Annual Reports of Boards in cities and towns, to Department, due. (Before 1st January.)
 4. Names and addresses of Public School Trustees and Teachers to be sent to Township Clerk and Inspector. (P. S. Act, sec. 18 (1).) (Before 1st January.)
 5. Trustees' Annual Reports to Inspectors, due. (P. S. Act, sec. 18 (2), sec. 109.) (On or before 1st January.)
 6. Application for Legislative apportionment for inspection of Public Schools in cities and towns separated from the county, to Department, due. (1st January.)
 7. Annual Reports of Kindergarten attendance, to Department, due. (Not later than 1st January.)
 8. Annual Report of Separate Schools, to Department, due. (P. S. Act, sec. 28 (18); 33 (9).) (On or before 1st January.)
 9. Appointment of High School Trustees by Municipal Councils. (P. S. Act, sec. 12 (1), Mun. Act, sec. 587.) (On Monday in January.)
 10. Provincial Normal Schools open (First Session.) (Beg. 1st Jan. and Term begins January.)
 11. First meeting of Public School Boards in cities, towns, and incorporated villages. (P. S. Act, sec. 61 (1).) (1st Wednesday in January.)
 12. Appointment of High School Trustees by County Councils. (P. S. Act, sec. 12 (1), Mun. Act, sec. 587.) (1st Tuesday in January.)

Note: The italicized portions in parentheses give the wording of the law and regulations as the authority for the dates.
